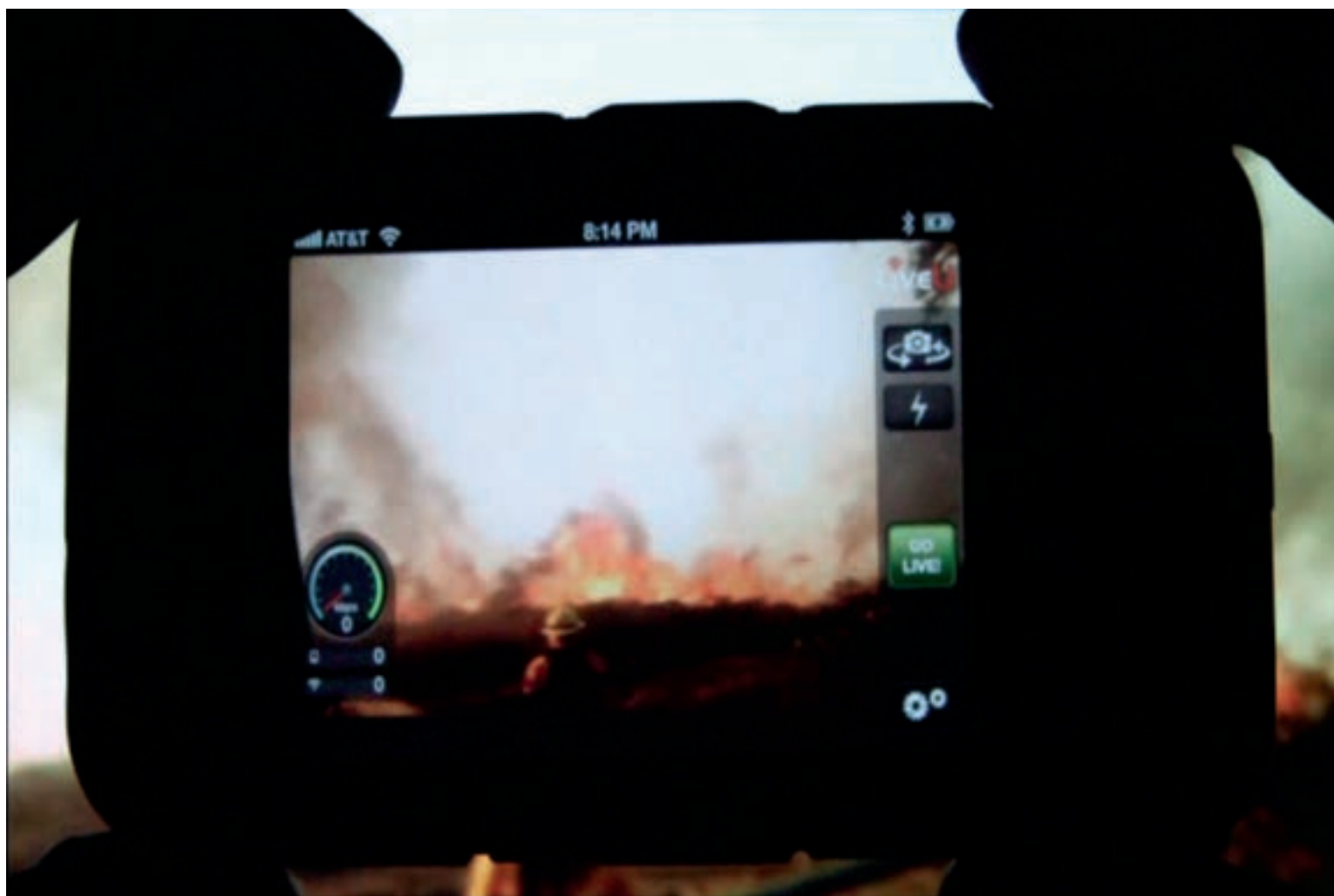

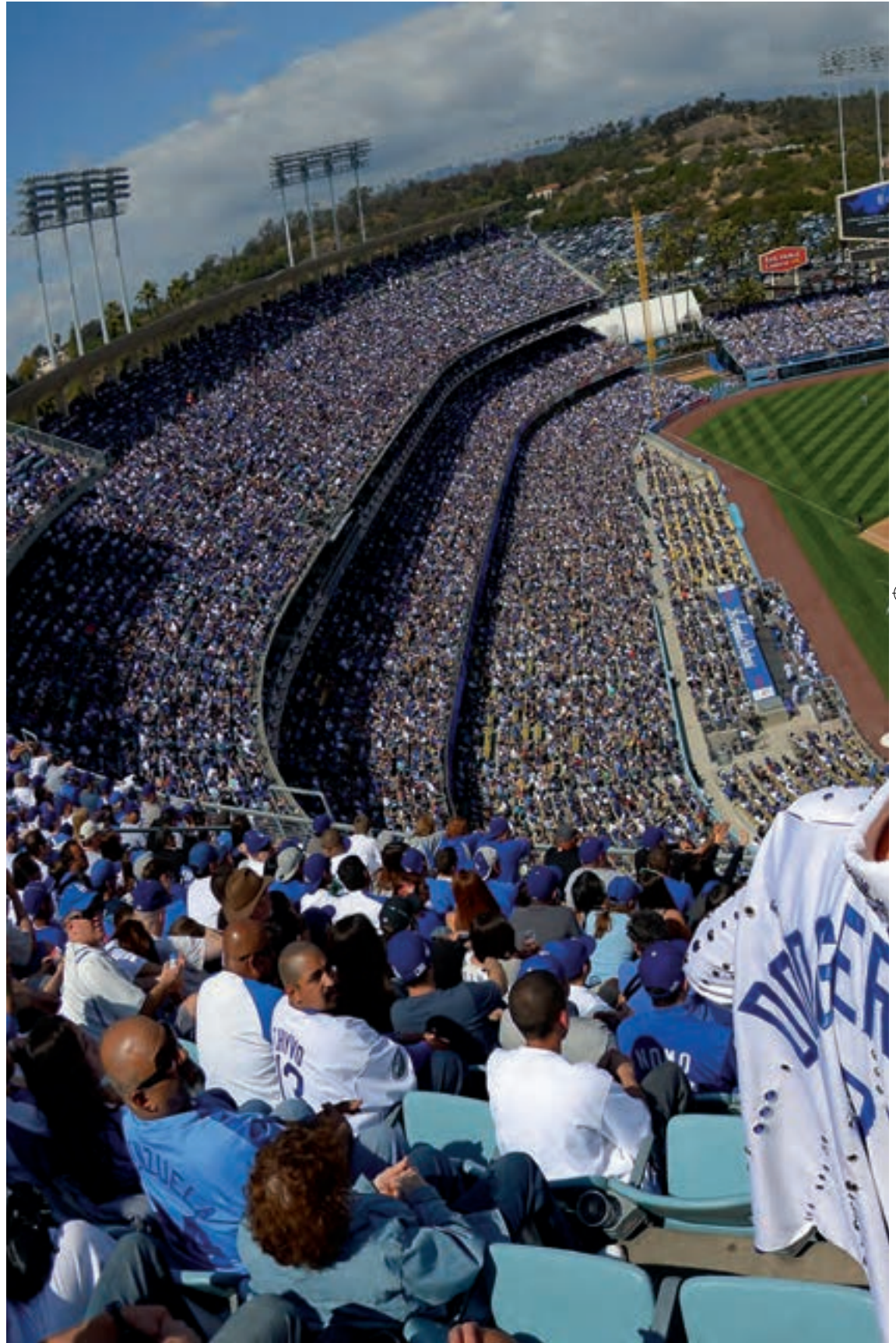

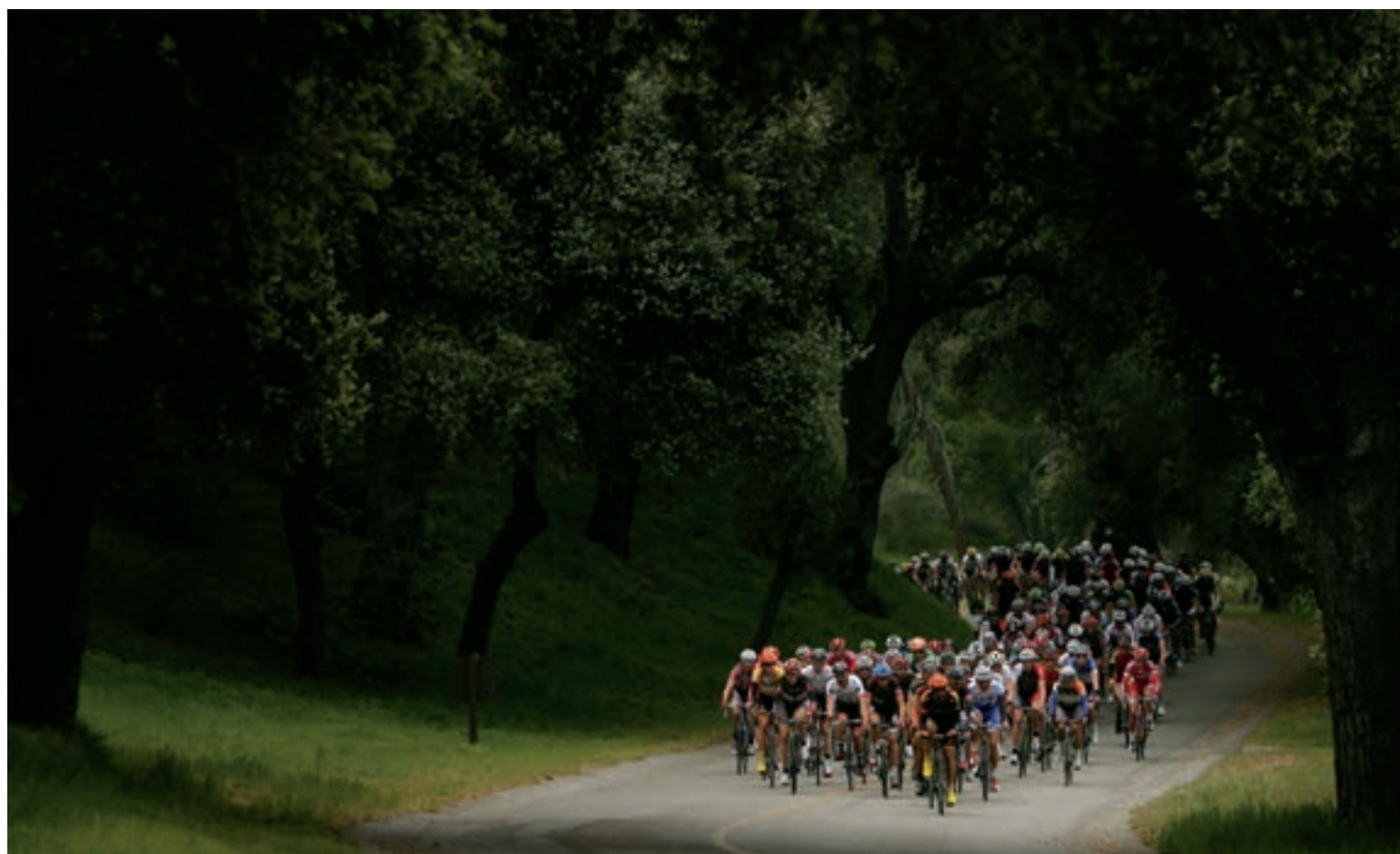

Dorothy Edwards, 56, who was identified as one of Pasadena's most vulnerable and likely to die on the streets lives in a tent along the 210 Freeway before being housed under the Housing First model. Dorothy, a 40-year drug addict, comes out of her secluded compound during one of her many trips to Target, which is close by. It is there she gathered water, used the facilities and made her base to panhandle. She later credited the staff at Target for their kindness.



"I had no hope: I thought I was going to die out there on the streets. My biggest fear was that something really bad was going to happen to me, and nobody would ever find me."



The despair Dorothy felt contrasted with her middle-class upbringing. “I never in my wildest dreams ever imagined I’d be homeless,” she said. “We had a built-in pool, waterfall, pool table, huge house. My parents cared about my grades.”



Dorothy runs into old friends, who pass her a bottle as she “flies a sign” at the parking lot entrance to Target. Shawn Morrissey, of Housing Works, was in the process of helping her off the streets and initially Dorothy was skeptical and suspicious. Later, after Dorothy had a home, he convinced her to seek treatment for her drug addiction.



“I love this place. It’s like, I look around, it’s all mine. It’s hard for me to believe. I’ll do anything to keep it, and my life. And to show the people who helped me how grateful I am.”

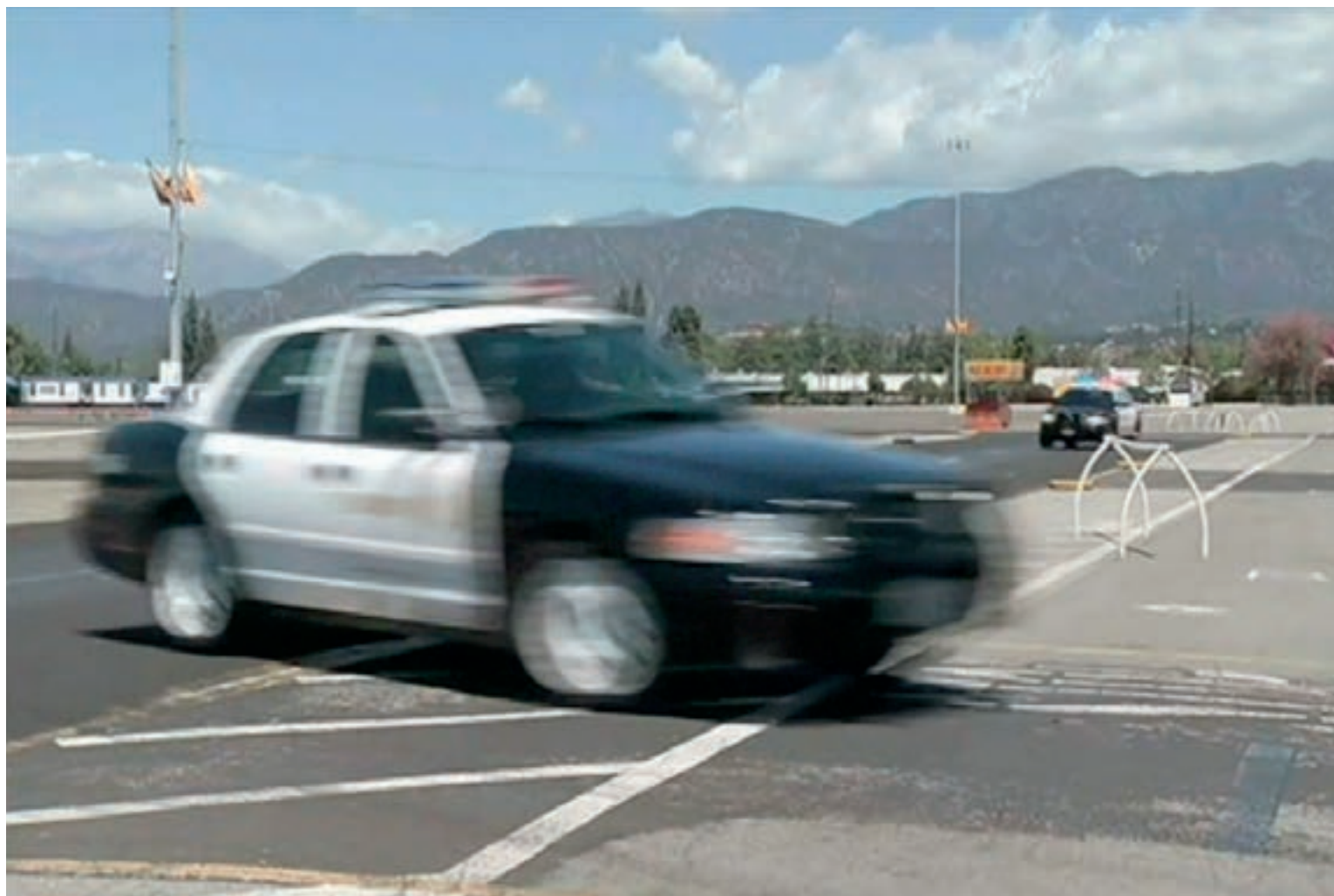

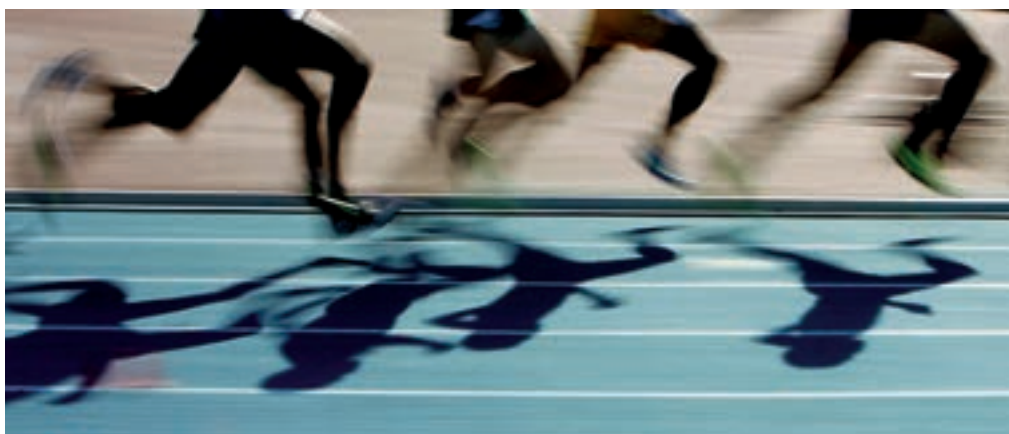

Lifetime Achievement

George Robert Smith



George Robert Smith aka Bob Smith was born on Oct. 25, 1932, at his grandfather's home on the front porch.

At 15, Bob went to work for a local printer in St. Louis cleaning ink bowls for a short while. A year later he learned of a job opening at Commercial Blueprint Co., worked there and learned a lot.

From there he worked at the St. Louis Public Library and was hired as a book shelfer and photo operator.

He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force during the Korean War and spent four years serving. He learned how to be a mechanic after basic camp.

He was then sent to Alaska where he took courses to finish high school. He enrolled in photography school and did well in his classes.

The USAF discovered being a mechanic was not his strong point. They looked over his records

and diploma and sent him to the photographer outfit in Washington State. Bob took to it like a fish takes to water and won some photo awards while there.

After leaving the Air Force, he took advantage of the G.I. Bill of Rights to complete his training in photography. Max Specht, his photo instructor, sent him to the Evening Outlook to work for them. The Evening Outlook was Santa Monica's premiere newspaper.

In 1962, Robert became the department head and considered the early years to be the good years. He won several photo awards and covered everything including U.S. Presidents and celebrities. Bob worked at the Evening Outlook for about 42 years before retiring. After The Evening Outlook was sold, he did their advertising shoots. When digital came along he knew his time was over and called it quits.

Bob remembers his father was a salesman who moonlighted doing wedding photos. He remembers as a child being asked what he wanted to be when he grew up. He always said he wanted to be a PHOTOGRAPHER.



Glenn Waggoner



Glenn Waggoner Jr.'s historic career in photojournalism began very simply, through a program in high school shooting local high school football and basketball games in the Los Angeles area.

Before he was done, he would end up being nominated for multiple Pulitzer Prizes (including three in one year), and got to photograph prominent politicians and celebrities at the apex of their careers.

Talking with Waggoner about his career is better than sitting through a 20th Century U.S. History class.

He was on a train as a child when President Roosevelt passed by in a wheelchair, giving him a chance to photograph the first of many presidents in his illustrious career. Nixon, Carter, Reagan. You name them, he photographed them.

He was there for tragedy – Waggoner was one of the first on the scene at the death of Marilyn Monroe – and triumph, having shot the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles and multiple Super Bowls.

Monroe's death wasn't the only

major celebrity event where Waggoner was one of the first on the scene.

He also was able to get some of the first photos of a young Frank Sinatra, Jr., after he was recovered in December 1963 following a kidnapping for ransom.

Even when things appeared to be against him, such as when UPI cut him loose in the early 90s, he still kept on, teaming with a writer to form their own entertainment wire and utilizing the early days of the Internet to change the ways in which newspapers and emerging news and entertainment websites received photos.

Family was critically important to Glenn, who took his wife and children with him to a number of events, including Presidential press conferences in the early days of his career and the Academy Awards.

He would use his sons, Howard and Glenn III, to help serve as runners to the deadline room to deliver film and collect tear sheets as Glenn snapped away.

He'd go on tour with Bob Hope, traveling on USO tours and

blending right in with the celebrity culture.

And as crazy as that might seem, Waggoner was nearly face-to-face with someone who was truly just that.

"Charles Manson said I looked crazy," Waggoner says. "I'll take that as a compliment."

He covered protests during the Iran hostage crisis, more fires than he can remember and had cyanide-laced bullets ricocheting off the curb in front of him during a 1974 shootout between Los Angeles police and members of the Symbionese Liberation Army.

He was a witness to some of the most memorable events and people over the latter half of the 20th Century, and despite knowing at the time he was witnessing history, he never lost focus of his job at hand.

"When you're shooting presidents and the like, it's always interesting when you get to tell them where to move and what to do," he says.
