Founded in 1936 by a group of 24 photographers, the "Hollywood Press Photographers Association" was organized to improve the quality of news photographs, bestow professional recognition, and exchange ideas. A few years later, they changed the name to Press Photographers Association of Greater Los Angeles.

We are a 50lc3 not-for-profit organization, made up of over 400 still and video photojournalists, independent photographers and photojournalism students who work on newspapers, at television stations, wire services, national news and sports publications throughout Southern California and across the country. Over 30 years ago, the organization expanded its outreach to include student members, and has funded scholarships, seminars and portfolio reviews for deserving journalism students ever since.

Now, eighty - four years since our founding, the 5X7 Graflex cameras with glass plates are long gone, but our mission remains the same. Our members face new challenges. Media restrictions, access problems, emerging technology, dangers in the workplace and a changing economy are all concerns for the next decade.

You can count on the Press Photographers Association of Greater Los Angeles to recognize change, identify problems, and offer solutions for our members and the PPAGLA organization.







Dear Members,

This historic year has been one of the most challenging times in our lives. We've been tested in ways we couldn't have imagined as the Covid-I9 pandemic changed the world. For many of us, losing our jobs due to the pandemic has been the hardest thing. For others, keeping the staff positions we have feels precarious at best. Some of us lost family and friends to the virus. My heart goes out to everyone who was tragically affected. As I write this, a vaccine has just been approved and we hope for better days ahead.

But through these trying times, one thing hasn't changed: the power of a great photo to make a difference in the world. Photojournalists are now more essential than ever.

Our jobs were riskier this year as the pandemic, a difficult election season, and a worldwide movement following the death of George Floyd changed our world. Discussions about safety were frequent. Conversations that began with lines like "I have a family to feed. They count on me. Does this career still make sense?" Or, "We have young children. I want to know I'll be there for them." This past year made us all think more deeply about why we do what we do.

In the end, we are all storytellers. We chose to keep documenting our world, and found ways to do that while taking into account the risks we could each tolerate. Some of us were able to run into the heart of the pandemic, into crowds, and into hospitals, while others were documenting things from more of a distance. But everything we did was important. We were all part of the story.

When we weren't out covering the story, our board was holding down the fort. We put together a resource list on our website, and updated it regularly with financial, COVID-19, and mental health resources. The 8-Ball Foundation was a wonderful support. We called many on the roster to see if they were ok and brought groceries to those most at risk. We were able to help some members secure vaccines.

We started off the year with a bang hearing a fabulous talk by Pulitzer winner and member Don Bartletti at Canon Burbank in February. As the pandemic unfolded, we quickly pivoted and held events online including: Drones with Travis Geske and Ann Johansson, Astrophotography with Raul Roa, and Portrait Lighting with Terry Pierson. We capped off the year with a New Year's party on Zoom. All of these events played to a packed house. We have rock stars in our midst!

Participation in contests skyrocketed as they were revitalized to build community and educate. Stills: redesigned as a Quarterly system and very cool web galleries. Video: streamlined, revised categories. These online galleries are being used as teaching resources around the country in Junior Highs, High Schools, Colleges and Universities during online pandemic learning. We are building something for the future. An archive. A record of how the masters do it.

All contests were blind-judged by committees. Gary Brainard led the Video Committee. David LaBelle led Stills. We had a record number of entries - nearly 2,000 images were submitted. Our judges for the annual contest hailed from across the country: David LaBelle, Ellen Jaskol, Rick Loomis, and Billy Weeks.

Our Awards Ceremony moved online, was emceed by Dave Lopez, and had an audience of over 200 members from LA and across the miles. Our wonderful sponsors stepped in to help, and presented awards and raffle prizes live and on video. Their presence at the ceremony was a morale boost and a great help with fundraising. Every frame mattered. Each one of you matters. Like fabric pieces in a quilt, we were all part of the story this year. Much like this book: over 350 images inside, all woven together to make something bigger than any one of us could have done alone.

We are here for you. We will get through this. Together.

























Palliative care at Providence Holy Cross Medical Center in Mission Hills, Calif. is the medical specialty that helps improve the quality of life for patients with serious illnesses; everything from the curable, such as trauma or certain cancers, to those that bring people to the end of their days. It aims to support the whole patient and the whole family with nurses, social workers, chaplains and doctors.

It is difficult to find a circumstance that has hit Dr. Marwa Kilani's team as hard as the pandemic. Before the coronavirus swept through Los Angeles County infecting more than 636,000 and killing nearly 9,000 people, Holy Cross' palliative care team averaged about 20 cases at any given time. In early December that caseload hit 60. In one recent four-day-period, I2 of the team's patients died.

During the second week in December, the hospital's COVID unit reached capacity, and there was no longer room for families to visit loved ones as they died of the virus. On Monday, a member of the palliative care team tested positive.

Holy Cross has cared for more than 1,350 people with COVID-19 since March. The current surge has forced the hospital to turn basement lab space into patient rooms. COVID-19 patients now take up the hospital's entire recently expanded south tower. Half of all palliative care patients have the virus.

Kilani was a medical student in the 1990s, during the last health crisis that rocked the nation, when HIV/AIDs spread pain and panic. The similarities between that disaster and this one are glaring: The stigma. The victim blaming. The inequity.

Both diseases, she said, lay bare the wide chasm between the haves and have-nots, between who gets good care and who has little access to treatment. Because hospital visits are largely banned the palliative care team often steps in, a kind of "substitute" for family. Which is why she does not wear gloves as she makes her rounds in the COVID unit.

Touch, she said, is healing. Her hands are raw from constant scrubbing and sanitizer, her nails, dry and split.















As the surge continued, restaurants were required to close indoor dining and move tables into the streets and parking lots. By mid-December, all on site dining was forbidden, allowing only take-out and delivery service. The PPE, he said, "says welcome but keep your distance. It's a very ironic interaction." He and his family and staff have had to adapt to a "new normal "several times during the pandemic.



As people continue to stay and eat at home and new indoor dining bans emerge across the country, restaurateurs have struggled to keep up sales, with many of the hardest-hit areas in states such as New York and Illinois. Almost 90% of full-service restaurants in the survey reported declines, with revenue falling 36% on average.





Angeles, Calif. struggles to keep up with the demands of rising death rates in a community suffering with health and finances. Breakrooms are filled with caskets containing bodies as it takes longer to process the dead because County and State systems are overloaded with death certificate applications.

Felipe Juarez, a victim of Covid-19, is memorialized at Continental Funeral Home Los Angeles's first outdoor service in compliance of State and City mandates preventing indoor gatherings. Under a large canopy in the parking lot of the funeral home in Los Angeles, Calif. more than two dozen folding chairs were carefully placed several feet apart facing the cherrywood casket. Juarez, 59, died of COVID-19 four days after the same disease killed his younger brother. And a month after it took the life of his sister in Mexico. After such an unspeakable series of losses, the family felt forced to settle for a funeral that was nothing if not surreal. Family members had gathered to say their goodbyes amid the melodic chime of a passing ice cream truck and the noise of rush hour traffic on Beverly Blvd. Philip Juarez, 31, felt like he was disrespecting his father, but he knew the pandemic left the family no choice. Still, he said, "it's hard to accept."

> In California, Latinos make up 39% of the state's population but account for 59% of COVID-19 infections and 47% of deaths, according to the state Department of Public Health. Immigrants have been particularly hard-hit economically amid the pandemic, with a lot losing their jobs and facing financial collapse. Many of the dead are shipped to Mexico, causing funeral homes in Los Angeles to suffer delays and overflowing storage. Bodies are stored in an anteroom as they await transport to the airport.



In a nondescript room, #3II, at the end of a long hall, at the Days Inn by Wyndham, in West Covina, California, the lifeless body of Judy Bounthong, 58, an ob-gyn tech at Emanate Queen of the Valley Hospital, was discovered. Bounthong died of coronavirus complications, near the end of her I4-day isolation period and wasn't discovered for several days.

Kristina McGuire, an investigator with the Los Angeles County Dept. of Medical Examiner-Coroner, arrived with Jerry Meza, forensic attendant, to handle the removal of her body and compile a report of her findings at the scene. On this day, Oct. 8, 2020, in Los Angeles County there were more than 270,000 positive cases of COVID-19, with death over 6,700. Within three months, at year's end, the County would be under siege, with positive cases passing 900,000 and deaths topping 12,000. At the end of 2020, the United States had more than 20 million positive cases and over 300,000 deaths from COVID-19.

"WALK OF REMEMBRANCE" MIKE NELSON, Independent

Albert Willner, a retired US Army colonel and his friend Mike Bayles walked the Death March his father and other concentration camp prisoners made 75 years ago when they were forced along with 4,000 other prisoners to march from Auschwitz on 2I January 1945. Approximately 56,000 prisoners most of them Jews were evacuated from Auschwitz-Birkenau and its concentration sub camps. It is estimated that possibly up to 250,000 prisoners from Nazi concentration camps in Poland were evacuated in January 1945 in the face of the Soviet Army advance. The exact routes of the dozens of death marches are not precisely known. Al Willner after extensive research and help from archivists and historians throughout Europe and the United States pieced together the most probably route his father from Blechhammer. Al and Mike walked the route in 10 days to pay tribute to those that suffered and died.













The phenomenon is associated with a red tide, or an algae bloom, filled with dinoflagellates which react with bioluminescence when jostled by the moving water. During the daytime, due to the pigmentation of the dinoflagellates, the water can turn a deep red, brown, or orange color, giving red tides their name.
